

### **ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES**

The IV Year Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) students embarked on an educational tour to Northern India from 17th January 2025 to 27th January 2025. The purpose of the tour was to offer students an opportunity to explore the cultural heritage, historical monuments, and technological advancements in the cities of Agra, Amritsar, Manali, and Delhi. In addition to enriching their academic exposure, the trip aimed to broaden their perspective on the diversity and history of India





The educational tour was conducted for 8th semester Civil Engineering students, where 25 students (5girls and 20 boys) and 3 staff members participated to understand a certain context and design of Indian society and culture. The aim of the tour was to expose students to understanding contours, society, culture and architectural design used in different places, and the history of India.
